She knows the answer.
It knows the answer.

We know the answer.
You know the answer.
They know the answer.

7. Verb: see

☺ Singular:

I see the ball.
You see the ball.
He sees the ball.
She sees the ball.
It sees the ball.

We see the ball.
You see the ball.
They see the ball.

10. Verb: like

☺ Singular:

I like pizza.
You like pizza.
He likes pizza.
She likes pizza.
It likes pizza.

☺☺ Plural:

We like pizza.
You like pizza.
They like pizza.

☺ Singular:

I run fast.
You run fast.
He runs fast.
She runs fast.
It runs fast.

We run fast.
You run fast.
They run fast.

☺ Singular:

I draw great pictures.
You draw great pictures.
He draws great pictures.
She draws great pictures.
It draws great pictures.

You draw great pictures.
They draw great pictures.
We draw great pictures.

Questions: Statements:

☺ Singular

Am I going? I am going. I am not going.
Are you going? You are going. You are not going.
Is he going? He is going. He is not going.
Is she going? She is going. She is not going.
Is it going? It is going. It is not going.

☺☺ Plural

Are we going? We are going. We are not going.
Are you going? You are going. You are not going.
Are they going? They are going. They are not going.

It's hailing instead!

Q: *Are we playing outside at recess?*
A: No, we aren't playing outside.
We're not playing outside at recess.
We're playing inside instead.

8. Verb: look

Q: *Are you looking for your little brother?*
A: No, we aren't looking for him.
We're not looking for him.
We're looking for our mom.

9. Verb: walk

Q: *Are they walking home today?*
A: No, they aren't walking home.
They're not walking home today.
They're riding home with me.

10. Verb: laugh

Q: *Are they laughing at him?*
A: No, they aren't laughing at him.
They're not laughing at him.
They're laughing at a joke he told.

(Using "going" in the question, all answers are "yes.")

A: Yes, I'm going to eat these fries!

I will eat these fries right now.
